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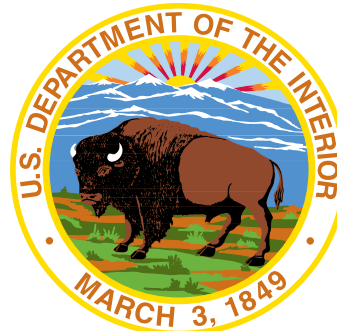

BUREAU of INDIAN AFFAIRS

Provides service directly, or through contracts and grants, to Native American Indians, Eskimos, and Aleuts who reside in 31 states and carries out the government to government functions for the U.S. with 327 Indian tribes and 223 Native Alaskan organizations. Other programs include law enforcement, social services, trust fund management, loans, business development, environmental services, construction, information technology, gaming, agriculture, forest and timber management, and fish and game management.



NATIONAL PARK SERVICE

Mission is to preserve the past, manage the present, and invest in the future of the 390 areas that make up the National Park System. Promote and regulate the use of the Federal areas known as national parks and monuments, and conform to the fundamental purpose to conserve the scenery, the nature, historic objects, the wildlife therein and to provide for the enjoyment of future generations. www.nps.gov



U.S. FISH & WILDLIFE SERVICE

Is responsible for the conservation and protection of fish and wildlife and their habitats through Federal programs relating to wild birds, endangered species, certain marine mammals, inland sport fisheries, and specific fishery and wildlife research activities. www.fws.gov



OFFICE OF SURFACE MINING, RECLAMATION and ENFORCEMENT

Mission is to safeguard the people and the environment; regulate adverse effects of surface coal mining operations; and, amend the damage of the past mining operations. www.osmre.gov



BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT

Is responsible for managing the nation's public lands and resources in a combination of ways that best serve the needs of the American people. Management is based on the principles of multiple use and sustained yield; a combination of uses that balances the needs of future generations for renewable and nonrenewable resources. These resources include recreation, range, timber, minerals, watershed, fish and wildlife, wilderness, and natural scenic, scientific and cultural values. www.blm.gov



MINERALS MANAGEMENT SERVICE

Mission is to provide stewardship of the leasing activities on the Outer Continental Shelf and to provide for the efficient collection of royalties. The areas of responsibility in carrying out this mission include: planning, resource evaluation, environmental assessment, leasing, inspection and enforcement, public participation, and the collection of fees due from Offshore leases as well as fees due from leases on Federal and Indian lands. www.mms.gov
